Vernon Township Cemeteries

Voter Registration at Vernon Township closes March 12, 2013.

WHO CAN REGISTER TO VOTE?

You may register to vote if you are:

- A United States citizen
- 18 years of age by the date of the next election
- A resident of your Lake County precinct address for 30 days immediately prior to an election.

Two forms of identification are required to register through a deputy registrar. At least one of the two forms must show your name and current address. Only one form of identification may be a piece of mail for a contractual service addressed and delivered to you

DOES MY VOTER REGISTRATION EXPIRE?

Your voter registration does not expire unless you move or change your name.

Change of name - Should you change your name by marriage, divorce or other legal name change, you must re-register under your new name and provide the new signature on your registration record. Change of address - If you move within Lake County, you must provide written notification of your new address and sign the request.

Mail notification including your name, old and new address, date of birth and your signature or complete the back of your voter I.D. card including your signature. Both of these should be mailed to the County Clerk's Office.

VOTER PROGRAMS

Voting By Mail - You can request a one-time ballot or a Permanent Application for a Ballot by mail by visiting Voter Power and clicking the "Application to Vote by Mail" button. For more information, contact the Voting by Mail department by e-mail at VotingByMail@lakecountyil.gov or call (847) 377-2406.

Snowbird Program-This program is intended to simplify voting for registered voters who temporarily vacation or visit outside their precinct each year. Those enrolled will automatically receive an application for ballot by mail as specified. Use the enrollment form which can be printed, signed and mailed to us. (Form is available at Vernon Township or on line at www. countyclerk.lakecountyil.gov)

Student Program- Our Temporarily Absent Student Program is available to students away at school. This program simplifies voting for students who wish to receive an application for ballot at their school address prior to each election. A student must be a registered voter in order to enroll in this program. (Form is available at Vernon Township or on line at www.countyclerk. lakecountyil.gov)

2013- FISHING AND HUNTING LICENSE

The 2013 Hunting and Fishing Licenses are now available at the Vernon Township Administration Building. For further information on fees and regulations you may visit the Illinois Department of Natural Resources web site at www.dnr.state.il.us.

When discarding items into the dumpsters, please take the time to do so in such a way that will allow for the maximum use of the space provided. Please refrain from filling the dumpsters over the top. Unfortunately there are some items that cannot be disposed of into the dumpsters, and they are:

- Appliances of any kind
- Tires
- Paint, solvents, household hazardous materials or chemicals
- Yard waste (grass clippings, brush or tree limbs)

Save the Rain For A Sunny Day

A rain barrel connected to your downspout is a great way to keep storm water out of the system and to cut down on your water bill. Because you are collecting right off the roof, it has few contaminants and is perfect for watering the garden.

Diverting water from your downspout into a rainwater catchment system has several advantages:

- Reduces the volume of water flowing to the sewer treatment facility
- Backup source of water during times of drought or between rain showers
- Helps to keep our creaks and beaches clean
- Saves money lowering your water bill

- Naturally softened water-great for delicate houseplants, auto cleaning and window washing
- Reduces the need for additional tax dollars earmarked for sewer expansion
- Chlorine-free water helps maintain a healthy biotic community in the soil

The 2013 Rain Barrel sale is sponsored by Lake County Storm water Management Commission and the Solid Waste Agency of Lake County. The sale will occur on Saturday, May 11th at Independence Grove Forest Preserve, Libertyville. The cost is approximately \$60.

Culvert Maintenance

Keeping the culvert(s) in front of your residence free of debris is important for proper drainage. A periodic check of your culvert(s) and removal of any debris can reduce flooding during the rainy season. If you live in Unincorporated Vernon Township and have difficulty removing any debris or you find a plugged culvert, please contact the Vernon Township Highway Department at (847)634-4600.

Permits

Permits are required when you are doing work on the ditch, culvert, trees, bushes and driveways in the right of way. The right of way is approximately 20' from the edge of the road. Permits can be obtained from the Vernon Township Highway Commissioner.

From the Desk of the Assessor

2011 Tax Bill

Homeowners requiring a copy of their tax bills for income tax purposes may obtain them from the Lake County's Treasurer's web site at: http://lakecountyil.gov/TREASURER/Pages/default.aspx, or go to the county's main web page at: www.lakecountyil.gov and click on the Treasurer's department link. Users will need the property index number (PIN); however, if you do not have it available, your address will also work. If you have further questions about your tax bill you can call the Treasurer's Office at (847) 377-2323.

Circuit Breaker Applications 2013

Circuit Breaker, along with Illinois Cares RX, is no longer available due to the lack of funding in Illinois. This became effective on July 1, 2012. The only programs available now are:

- Seniors Free Transit Ride
- Disabled Person Free Transit Ride
- Secretary of State License Plate Discount

The NEW 2013 program is now called "BENEFIT ACCESS". To be more cost efficient the State will NO LONGER print and mail paper copies, all applications must be completed online.

To fill out an online application, go to: http://www.state.il.us/aging/, or just conduct an internet search for the "Illinois Department on Aging". Once on the web site you will notice a link to "Benefit Access Application on the right side of the web page. Click this link to begin the application process.

The Assessor's office can still assist seniors who DO NOT have a computer; however, to avoid potentially long delays, we strongly suggest you call to schedule an appointment. Please call between the hours of 8:30 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. at (847) 634-4602.

Please Take Note

Recently a taxpayer come to the Assessor's Office with a letter from a company stating a certified copy of the deed to his house can be purchased for \$89.50. Homeowners should already have the original certified deed. During the home's closing an unrecorded copy is given to each homeowner, once it is recorded at the county level, a certified copy is sent within a few weeks. Homeowners can request another copy yourself if the original is lost. The Lake County Recorder of Deeds office will send an additional copy for a minimal cost. Please contact the Lake County Recorder of Deeds at (847) 377-2678 for more information.

Clarke Mosquito Abatement

As the weather gets warmer the emergence of mosquitoes begins. To help eliminate this continued threat, Vernon Township has again contracted with Clarke Mosquito Control to treat known areas in unincorporated Vernon Township. If you do not live in an unincorporated area, please contact the village you live in regarding their abatement program.

Vernon Township's "BackPacker" Club

Vernon Township will again be collecting gender neutral backpacks that are filled with school supplies for a specific grade. Passport Reminders

The summer travel season will soon be upon us! Be sure to check your passports for expiration prior to your trip! Most foreign countries require passports be within 6 months of expiration to enter into the country. The Township accepts passport applications Monday through Friday between the hours of 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Applications are available at the township or may be downloaded from the U. S. Department of State's web site at <u>www.travel.state.gov</u>.

To obtain a new passport book or card, you will need:

- A completed NEW application-DS-11-DATED 12/2010
- Proof of Citizenship, <u>one of the following</u>:
 - 1. A certified birth certificate from the county or state of birth; long form.
 - 2. An old Passport (children under 16 with old passport also need birth certificate)
 - 3. Original Naturalization Paper (if not born in the U.S.)
- Personal Identification (such as Drivers License)
- Two personal checks or money orders (the Township does not accept credit cards)
- One Passport photo (Photo may be taken at the township; no hair decorations are allowed unless for religious purposes.)

Applications completed on line and printed from the web site are bar coded. Changes may not be made once they are printed. When hand writing the application, only use <u>black pen</u> and do not scratch or cross off items. The passport agent may require a new application be written if completed in another ink color and/or not legible.

Every passport application must have the social security number on it. Applications will not be accepted if the social is not listed. The social security card does not need to be presented; the number only needs to be on the application.

Anyone applying for a passport must be present at the time the application is accepted, this includes children. Children under 16 require both parents signature. A parental consent form may be completed if one parent is unable to come to an acceptance agent to apply. For more information about the Parental Consent Form, please visit www.travel.state.gov.

Please note: Applicants may be turned away if all documentation is not presented at time of execution. Incomplete applications can not be held in our office. Be sure to have proof of citizenship, social security number, identification and check or money order at the time of application.

Prairie View Train Station Parking

As of August 27, 2012 the Buffalo Grove Police Department has been monitoring the station parking lot for parking violations. Please be aware that tickets are now being issued for:

- Paying for different space than what you parked in. Make sure the parking space number you are entering is the parking space your vehicle is parked in. Commuters who pay the daily fee but the receipt reflects a different parking space number may receive a ticket.
- Morning commuters who pay by phone after 8:30 a.m. We encouraged commuters to complete your transaction a.s.a.p. Tickets may be written if paid after 8:30 a.m.
- **Permits that are not displayed.** Permit holders should accurately supply your license number to the township at the time you purchase your permit. Every effort is made to check license plates for permits prior to issuing tickets but it is the responsibility of the permit holder to display the permit and to supply accurate license plate information for all vehicles.
- Not paying for daily parking. Parking is \$1.50 per day.

Parking violators will be issued a \$25.00 parking ticket. If the commuter has questions regarding a ticket or feels they were ticketed in error, they should contact the Village of Buffalo Grove, 50 Raupp Blvd., Buffalo Grove.

Permit applications for parking at the train station are available on our web site www.vernontownship.com, in the train station, or at the Township office. The application may be completed and mailed with a check and self-addressed stamped envelope to the township. The township will mail the permit to your home, or can be purchased at the township offices at 3050 N Main St., Buffalo Grove during business hours of Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

Pool Pass Information

Any person wishing to enjoy the Vernon Township Aquatic Center must have a valid season pass or purchase a daily pass at the pool registration desk. To be eligible for resident rates, you must provide proof of your Vernon Township residency with a valid driver's license or by a current real estate tax bill. Only those immediate family members and care givers living at your residence will be eligible for family rates. (See guidelines below.)

All season pass holders are required to have a photo identification card, issued by Vernon Township. If you cannot present this card to the pool attendant at the time of check-in, you will be charged the daily user rate.

Through the season, pool pass photos are taken at the Vernon Township Administrative Center, Monday - Friday, 8:30 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. For your convenience, additional pool pass photo hours are as follows:

Pass Guidelines

• Admission to the pool requires payment of a daily admission fee or a pool pass, regardless of age.

- A pool pass must be presented upon check-in at the pool. If you can not present the card at the time of check-in, you will be charged the daily user rate. No other form of identification will be accepted for admission into the pool.
- Pool passes are NOT transferable and not refundable.
- Only immediate family members living in your residence are eligible for family rates. Nannies and live-in baby sitters can be included, but must provide proof of residency at your address. (Drivers license or State of Illinois ID.) Live out nannies and baby sitters must purchase an individual pass or purchase a daily pass.

• All passes are property of Vernon Township and can be suspended or revoked at any time.

• Passes used fraudulently or false information on the registration form may result in all passes being revoked with no refund.

• A responsible adult over the age of 16 must accompany children ages 8 and below.

• Replacement passes are \$5.00
